Safe Schools Program Agreement

This agreement, is entered into by and between South Cook Intermediate Service Center #4, Cook County, IL, and Cook County School District CESD #4.

By signing this agreement, the school district agrees to the following terms, and therefore becomes eligible to place students into the Regional Institute for Scholastic Excellence.

The student will be administratively transferred from the local school district into the R.I.S.E. program for a period not less than one full Calendar semester from date of placement.

If a student enrolls two weeks after the start of a given semester, the student must remain through the following semester in order to complete the full semester requirement. The home school district is responsible for all tuition costs, which includes both semesters.

The home school district agrees to pay tuition costs for the semester, billed quarterly. The home school district agrees to pay full quarter tuition for any portion of the quarter the student is enrolled.

The R.I.S.E. program will claim the student for purposes of General State Aid pursuant to 105 ILCS5/13A of the Illinois School Code.

Student eligibility is determined by South Cook ISC 4 Governing Board policy and determination of R.I.S.E. program staff.

The home school district is responsible for transportation of the student to and from the program site.

The final determination of placement and/or return to the home school district lies with the Executive Director of South Cook ISC 4, and that decision is final.

The home school district accepts any and all credits earned through the R.I.S.E. program placement.

If the R.I.S.E. staff determines that the student has violated policy, procedure, or is not meeting the objectives of the I.O.E.P, a student transfer meeting will be convened, and the student may be administratively transferred back to the home school.

Permanent records of all students will be maintained in the home school district.

R.I.S.E. will maintain all temporary records and maintain confidentiality in accordance with the Illinois School Code.

Short-Term Program Agreement

This agreement is entered into by and between South Cook Intermediate Service Center and South Cook County School District CCSD 146

By signing this agreement, the school district agrees to the following terms, and therefore, becomes eligible to place students into the RISE Short-Term Program.

- * RISE Short-Term Program will maintain all temporary records for students and maintain confidentiality in accordance with the Illinois School Code
- * Permanent student records will be maintained by the homeschool
- * The home school agrees to pay tuition costs for the duration of the student placement
- * Tuition for the RISE Short-Term placement will be billed upon the completion of the student's placement
- * If there are unusual or extenuating circumstances regarding a student attendance, an adjustment to the daily fee will be considered
- * Transportation of the student to the RISE campus is the responsibility of the parent/family; the district is not required to transport the student to the RISE campus
- * If the RISE Short-Term staff determines that the student commits a serious offense, a meeting will be convened with the home school to determine future placement for the student
- * The final determination of placement and/or return to the home school lies with the Executive Director of South Cook ISC
