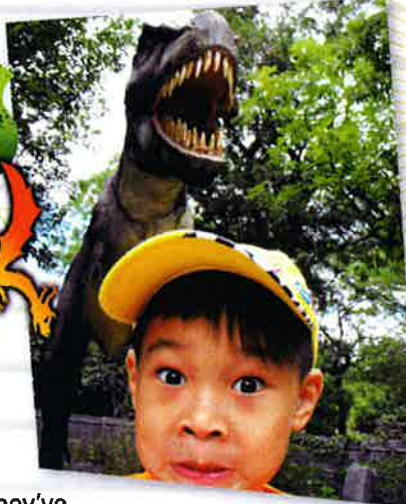

TAKE A PEEK!

At Brookfield Zoo, veterinary staff want to be the most effective at treating the animals in their care, so they rely on the latest technology to essentially peek inside an animal patient. Combining this specialized viewpoint with careful analysis of the external symptoms of a patient, they can make a thorough diagnosis.

This visual capability is so important to animal care efforts here that the decision was made to invest in the most advanced radiological suite in the world. (A simple definition of the word "radiology" is the ability to obtain images for medical purposes.)

Brookfield Zoo is currently one of only two zoos in North America with an on-site computerized tomography (CT) scanner, recently donated by AMITAHealth La Grange. The CT scanner is much faster than our previous machine, significantly shortening



the time our animal patients need to be under anesthesia. It also produces higher-resolution scans that allow fantastic 3D image reconstruction.

It is the biggest veterinary model on the market, too, with a 660-pound table limit, so veterinary staff can now scan larger patients with greater ease. We have already performed scans on a dolphin, a gorilla, an okapi, and a pygmy hippo—just to name a few!
